## JUSTICE UNDER THE LAW: Elements of Murder

The "*elements*" of a crime are what a statute requires that a prosecutor prove beyond a reasonable doubt in order the obtain a conviction. In the case of murder, the elements of what used to called "first degree" murder are:

- A) The accused causes the death **[proximate causation]** of another person;
- B) the death is caused intentionally or knowingly [premeditation]

The elements of what used to be called "second degree" murder are:

- A) the accused causes the death **[proximate causation]** of another person;
- B) the accused's conduct manifests a depraved indifference to the value of human life [gross criminal negligence]
- C) the conduct in fact causes the death the other person [no intervening cause]
